

Hot Weather Policy

Rationale

The South Australian Rifle Association (S.A.R.A.) recognises that competing and working in hot weather can potentially be hazardous to health and that we particularly have a duty of care to any employees.

Accordingly, the following policy devised by S.A.R.A. applies to facilities and venues under S.A.R.A. control as from 13/02/2004. This policy applies to all members, administrators, officials, coaches, players and visitors of the S.A.R.A.

Policy on hot weather

The S.A.R.A. policy requires:

- If the temperature forecast for the day of a shoot is 38°C or higher, then all official events will be cancelled.
- The forecast temperature used will be that broadcast by ABC television during their evening (7:00pm) news service on the day prior to the

scheduled event.

• No outdoor range staff will be employed on these days.

Non-compliance

Non-compliance with this policy will result in disallowance of any results and disciplinary action being taken by the S.A.R.A. Council. Anyone wishing to discuss any aspect of this policy is invited to contact S.A.R.A. Executive Officer. Thank you for your cooperation.

Policy review

The policy on hot weather will be reviewed six (6) months after its introduction and then on an annual basis. This will ensure that the policy remains current and practical.
